



### 8. SUB-COMMITTEE REPORTS

### 8.1 BRANDING & MERCHANDISE COMMITTEE

#### Chairperson - Mr. Mahalingam Pradeep

The Branding and Merchandising Committee played a key role in strengthening the identity of S. Thomas' Preparatory School while contributing to the financial goals of the Union. The Committee's objectives for the year 2024/2025 were focused on three core areas: 1) enhancing sales of existing merchandise; 2) introducing new and relevant product lines; and 3) creating event-specific items that aligned with key milestones in the life of Prep School. A target of achieving sales for the value of Rs. 500,000/= for the year was set at the beginning of the financial year.

To effectively plan product rollouts and ensure their timely availability the Committee obtained the annual events calendar from the School administration. This allowed the team to align the launch of merchandise with the events being organised by the School and the OBU. A credit facility was established with key merchants to enable smoother procurement and better cash flow management. Quantities of each item were intentionally limited, ensuring exclusivity and avoiding excess inventory.

Throughout the year, a mix of heritage-inspired and practical merchandise were developed and sold. These included: Parker IM ballpoint pens - finished in black stainless steel with gold accents and engraved with the school crest; customized stainless steel water bottles (650ml and 900ml, BPA-free, double-walled insulated); themed notebooks; and Sheaffer gift sets. For student-focused initiatives, the Committee introduced exercise books and stationery packs tailored for school use. The 2025 desk calendar was also proposed, featuring full-color printing on high-quality art paper, adding a refined touch to the annual calendar of events.

A significant portion of merchandise sales centered around high-traffic events for the alumni. Notably, sales during the 43rd AGM and the Sing Along event organised by the Batch of 1998 accounted for a considerable share of the total revenue during the year. Merchandise items for these occasions included custom water bottles, Parker pens, and other accessories with branding specific to Prep School. In total, the Committee recorded merchandise sales exceeding Rs. 400,000 by early 2025, showing strong momentum toward meeting the annual sales goal.

As the year progressed, preparations began for the Sports Meet, with new product lines such as drawstring bags, caps, and t-shirts to match the event's energy and further foster School spirit. Products such as backstring bags were also lined up for approval as part of ongoing efforts to expand the merchandise portfolio.

It is hoped that the Prep Carnival, a flagship community event on Founder's Day will see large volumes of merchandise sales. The Committee played an instrumental role in enhancing the festive atmosphere and school spirit by designing and supplying



exclusive Prep Carnival t-shirts, branded caps, and string bags. It is hoped that these items will not only contribute to the visual identity of the event but also generate substantial interest and sales among attendees, including parents, students, and alumni.

The Branding and Merchandising Committee remains committed to enhancing the visibility of the Old Boys' Union and the School's legacy through well-crafted merchandise. These efforts not only strengthen alumni engagement and school pride but also provide valuable financial support for activities of the Union.

### 8.2 FUND RAISING COMMITTEE

### Chairperson - Mr. Asanga Seneviratne

During the year under review, the Fund Raising Committee remained focused on securing financial support for both activities of the School and the operational needs of the Union. In line with its mandate, the Ccommittee worked on identifying funding opportunities, managing allocations for key School events, and contributing to the development of a comprehensive budget to guide the activities of the Union.

One of the most anticipated events of the year, Prep Carnival 2025, is set to take place later this evening, on 17th May 2025, in celebration of the School's 87th Founders' Day. Jointly organized with the School Administration, the Parent-Techers Association and the OBU, the Prep Carnival stands as the Union's flagship fundraising initiative for the year. The Fund Raising Committee has been instrumental in steering all aspects of its planning and execution including sponsor coordination and vendor management. The event is expected to attract a strong turnout and generate significant funds in support of the School's ongoing development goals.

In addition to event execution, the Committee also initiated discussions with S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia, to explore collaborative fundraising efforts. This partnership aims to align event calendars and pool resources in a way that supports the broader goals of both institutions. These discussions mark an important step toward strengthening cross-campus engagement and shared fundraising strategies.

Throughout the year, the committee also revisited ongoing projects and explored new opportunities for long-term financial sustainability. This included considering future fundraising ideas that support the School's 'Master Plan' and introduce cost-saving measures. As the drivers of the Union's fundraising efforts, the Committee remains committed to giving financial stewardship, supporting infrastructure development, and ensuring that the OBU can continue to meet its objectives in the years ahead.

Over the past year, the Infrastructure Development Committee worked closely with the administration of the School, including the Board of Governors and the Manager of the School, in supporting efforts to uplift and maintain the infrastructure of S. Thomas' Preparatory School.

Regular engagements with the Headmaster and the Manager of the School allowed the Committee to contribute meaningfully to ongoing discussions around the school's long-term 'Master Plan' ensuring that the Union remained an active partner in shaping the future of the campus. Throughout the year, the Committee also participated in discussions on proposed renovation to the Middle School Block.

In addition to contributing to strategic planning, the committee also extended support for several immediate and essential projects. One such project was the reconstruction of the School's Western boundary wall, a section of which collapsed due to the proximity to the sea and structural weakness. The Committee, on invitation by the Headmaster, acted swiftly to address this critical safety concern. Temporary safety measures were first implemented and reconstruction work on the wall was completed while ensuring the safety of students.

The Union continues to provide financial assistance where required and remains committed to supporting school-led initiatives.

The Committee was also given the task of developing the J. S. L. Fernando Memorial Room which has been allocated for the use by the Union for alumni coordination and administration. Towards, this end the Committee is drawing up plans to make optimal use of the space for administrative and archive purposes of the Union for the benefit of the alumni. The first step in this plan will been taken on the 17<sup>th</sup> of May 2025 when the photographs of all the past Secretaries of the Union will be unveiled.

The Committee expresses its sincere appreciation to the Headmaster, Rev. Nihal Fernando, for his tireless efforts in preserving and enhancing the school environment, despite the many operational challenges and for seeking the involvement of the Union. The Committee also extends its gratitude to the membership of the Union and various batches who have consistently come forward to support infrastructure-related initiatives. Their generosity and responsiveness have been instrumental in ensuring that the Union can continue to contribute meaningfully to the development of our *alma mater*.

### 8.4 LEGAL, RULES, PROCEDURES & PRACTICES COMMITTEE

The Legal, Rules, Procedures & Practices Committee continued its mandate of upholding governance, compliance and legal integrity across all activities of the Union and advising the Headmaster, when requested.

The Committee's primary objectives for 2024–2025 focused on the review of the Union's regulatory and procedural framework. This included a review of the Rules of the OBU, the Deed of the Trust Fund and the Guidelines for the work of the Executive Committee to ensure that these basic documents relating to the foundation and structure of the Union met the current needs of the Union and the School.

In addition, the Committee was called upon by the Headmaster and/or the Executive Committee to provide advise and support on matters of a legal or regulatory nature which included:

- Facilitation of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia: the Committee drafted an MoU between S. Thomas' College Mount Lavinia and Prep School to facilitate enhanced cooperation on sports;
- Advise to the Headmaster on labour laws and regulations
- **Drafting and review of legal documentation**: all legal documents, including all the contracts for the Prep Carnival, were either drafted or reviewed by the Committee with the aim of protecting the interests of the School and the Union
- Legal Advisory Support: the Committee advised bot the Headmaster and the Executive Committee on issues requiring clarity in relation to governance, contractual terms, or procedural compliance.

The Committee remains committed to ensuring that the activities of the Union are governed by a legal framework and sound governance practices. The work undertaken this year reflects the Committees continued effort to promote accountability, transparency, and fairness in Schooland Union initiatives.

**Facebook Page**: the public Facebook page continues to showcase a wide range of updates - from school news and event highlights to achievements of our alumni. It remains a powerful tool in expanding our reach and keeping the broader community informed.

**Facebook Group**: the private Prep OBU Facebook Group has grown to over 1,800 verified members. It remains a dynamic and interactive space where old boys can stay updated on OBU activities, share ideas, and engage with fellow alumni. The group requires a short verification process to ensure authenticity and exclusivity.

WhatsApp Batch Representatives Group: this platform continues to serve as a reliable, fast-paced communication channel between batch representatives and the Executive Committee. It allows for quick updates and coordinated efforts for events and initiatives. If your batch isn't represented, we encourage you to email us to get connected.



**Instagram**: the Union's Instagram presence (@prepobu) continues to resonate with younger alumni, featuring visually appealing content such as event recaps, school life snapshots, and community highlights. This platform helps bridge the generational gap and keeps younger Prepites engaged and involved.

### Content & Engagement

Throughout the 2024/2025 period, the Media Team has consistently shared content that reflects the vibrant spirit of the OBU and our community. - Designing and installing billboards, dropdown banners, and posters around the school to create awareness and anticipation among students and parents.
- Coordinating and executing print advertisements across leading newspapers such as Daily Mirror, Lankadeepa, Sunday Times, and Daily FT.
- Expanding our reach through radio and television advertisements, further enhancing visibility and drawing attention to the carnival beyond our immediate community.

8.6 *MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE* 

### Chairperson - Mr. Gayan Keppetipola

The Membership Development Committee remained focused during the year 2024–2025 on expanding the Union's member base, enhancing the value proposition for members and streamlining membership management processes. Guided by its core objectives, the Committee pursued the following key focus areas:

- **Expand Membership Base**: increase engagement across batches and onboard new members through both direct outreach and strategic partnerships.
- Enhance Value Proposition: develop initiatives that strengthen the appeal of OBU membership.
- **Database Management**: maintain accurate, up-to-date records of all registered members.
- Efficient Application Processing: ensure timely processing of new member applications and improved access to membership resources.



To support membership growth, a structured outreach model was introduced by segmenting Executive Committee members to engage with different age groups. This helped facilitate communication with respective batches and follow-up. In parallel, a short informative video to guide prospective members through the application process was developed by the Committee. This video was successfully launched on social media on December 10th helping raise awareness and improve engagement.

Efforts to clean and update the Membership Database continued throughout the year, with a planned completion target of December 2024. Follow-ups were conducted with past applicants and batches previously engaged during earlier drives to ensure no interested members were left out.

A key milestone was the automatic enrollment of the 2024 batch, with the membership fee collected alongside the school fees for the third-term. This streamlined approach ensured membership to the entire batch and is expected to serve as a model for future onboarding efforts.

The committee also sought to leverage Character Certificates issued by School to identify and approach eligible students and their families for post-school membership engagement. Although no new certificates were issued in recent months, the initiative remains ongoing.

Additionally, collaboration with the newly established Parent Teachers' Association has been initiated to identify parents who are former Prepites and encourage their active participation in the Union.

The Membership Development Committee remains committed to building a stronger and more inclusive alumni network through efficient processes, targeted engagement, and ongoing member support. These efforts continue to enhance the presence and sustainability of the Union.

### 8.7 OUTREACH COMMITTEE

The Outreach Committee's efforts during the year 2024–2025 were centered on strengthening engagement across the alumni community by building structured networks, enhancing communication channels and reviving key initiatives. With a clear mandate to widen the Union's reach beyond interactions which focused on batch/class groups, the Committee focused on inclusive, scalable approaches that cater to the diversity of the alumni.



Recognizing that the Union must evolve with its growing membership and the changing dynamics of alumni interaction, the Outreach Committee proposed a broader and more inclusive framework. The key goal was to create multiple, overlapping **networks** that enable alumni to connect with the School and each other in ways that go beyond traditional affiliations. These networks include:

- **Batch/Class-Based Groups**: covering alumni from 1938 through 2023, with WhatsApp groups set up and managed by batch representatives
- School Activity-Based Networks: alumni are grouped based on shared school interests and participation, in activities such as scouting, aesthetic interests such as drama and singing and sports
- **Professional Networks**: aimed at leveraging expertise and encouraging mentorship, these include:
- **Overseas Alumni Networks**: engaging Prepites domiciled abroad by establishing regional groups and facilitating virtual meetings.

To support the above vision, the committee initiated a timeline-based action plan that included:

- 1. **Creating WhatsApp Groups:** for registered batches, with formal representatives such as the President or Secretary added to ensure structured communication.
- 2. **Developing a Central Tracker:** to monitor and organize alumni networks formed around school activities and professions.
- 3. **Reconnecting with Overseas Chapters:** with efforts underway to identify active members and formalize representation across regions.
- 4. Setting Up WhatsApp Groups for Overseas Communities: enabling real-time updates and the coordination of virtual meetups.

The Outreach Committee remains committed to expanding and deepening engagement with the Prep School Community. Through these structured networks and communication initiatives, the Committee seeks to ensure that all alumni, regardless of age, location, or profession, have a meaningful and active connection to their *alma mater*.

### 8.8 SCHOOL LIAISON COMMITTEE

### Chairperson – Mr. Fayyaz Mukthar

The School Liaison Subcommittee continues to serve as a vital bridge between the Old Boys' Union and the School administration, with a primary focus on fostering meaningful engagement and contributing to the holistic development of both students and faculty. This year, the Committee focused its efforts on identifying key areas where targeted support and guidance could enrich the educational environment and overall well-being of the School's stakeholders.

#### **Faculty Engagement**

Initial discussions were held with school faculty to better understand their professional development needs. Through these conversations, several focus areas were identified that extend **beyond** conventional teaching methodologies:

- Legal Aspects of Education understanding the rights and responsibilities of educators in the context of evolving laws and policies on education
- **Psychological Approaches to Teaching** applying psychological insights to enhance classroom engagement and support diverse learning styles
- Stress Management & Mental Wellness providing tools and techniques for managing occupational stress and maintaining overall well-being

In response, the Committee connected with subject matter experts who have expressed willingness to conduct targeted training sessions and seminars on these topics. While arrangements are in progress, scheduling challenges due to a busy school calendar have necessitated a delayed rollout. Faculty involvement in various events, often extending into term holidays, has made it difficult to coordinate sessions during the school year. However, with continued support from the administration, the Committee aims to initiate these programs in the coming months.

#### Student Engagement

Parallel consultations with student leaders and counselors highlighted several areas where the student body could benefit from additional support and awareness-building. Based on these insights, the subcommittee is working on a series of programs covering:

- **Health & Nutrition** educating students on balanced diets, lifestyle habits, and the impact of physical health on academic performance
- **Peer Pressure & Emotional Resilience** addressing common social pressures faced by adolescents and promoting positive mental health practices



- **Balancing Academics & Sports** helping students manage time and expectations across both academic and extracurricular pursuits
- **Career Awareness & Guidance** introducing a wide range of career options and helping students make informed decisions about their futures.

These programs will be implemented in close coordination with the school administration on a staggered basis. The proposed cadence is one session every two months, allowing ample time for planning, execution, and follow-up while avoiding disruption to core academic activities.

The collaboration between the Committee and the leadership of the School has been instrumental in shaping these initiatives. The willingness of the administration to allocate time, space and personnel towards these efforts has laid the foundation for impactful engagement. The coming months will see these plans take form, as we continue to support the holistic development of the Prep School community through meaningful and timely interventions.

8.9 SPORTS DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

#### Chairperson - Mr. Romesh Tissainayagam

As in the past, during the year under review, the Sports Development Committee once again took initiatives to enhance the sporting culture at S. Thomas Preparatory School.

At the first meeting of the Executive Committee on 17th July 2024 the Sports Development Committee presented its year plan for 2024 -2025. The plan was an ambitious one with no less than seven (7) initiatives / projects being identified by the Committee in consultation with the administration of the School.

The most ambitious project that was identified was the construction of a cross fit centre for students along with artificial turfing of the School grounds (at the rear). The cost of the project was estimated to be in excess of Rupees Fifty Million and the Committee hoped to raise the funds primarily from the alumni both in Sri Lanka and from overseas. Initiatives were well underway to get the assistance of the alumni when the project had to be stopped in view of uncertainties that prevail with regard to the extension of the Marine Drive. Despite this setback the Committee, through the good offices of one of its active members Vice President Mr. Asanga Seneviratne, was successful in getting two cricket nets constructed free of with the assistance of Sri Lanka Cricket at the school premises to enhance the facilities for cricket practices within the school premises.



The Sports Development Committee also played a significant role in coordinating and finalising a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between S. Thomas College Mount Lavinia and S. Thomas' Preparatory School on sports.

The Sports Development Committee continued to hold quarterly meetings with the Teachers-in-Charge and Coaches of all the sports. These meetings were fruitful since it gave an opportunity for the Committee to understand the requirements of the students, teachers and coaches that needed to be addressed. During these discussions two important matters were identified, namely: 1) the fact that there was no proper scheme to reimburse teachers and coaches for incidental expenses they incurred such as for travel and meals; and that there wasn't a uniform contract for coaches. The Committee is in the process of addressing both these issues. A review is underway of the present scheme for reimbursement of incidental expenses incurred by teachers and coaches with a view to proposing a new formula for reimbursement and the Legal Committee is in the process of drafting a uniform contract for all coaching staff.

The Sports Development Committee takes this opportunity to thank the Headmaster for inviting the membership of the Union for the Youth Rugby Carnival which was organised by Prep School for the second successive year on 15th June 2024 and also for the press conference held to launch the event.

In conclusion, the Committee acknowledges the support given by the stakeholders who have helped the Committee in numerous ways in carrying out their tasks successfully.

### 9. FINANCIAL REPORT

In the fiscal year 2024/2025, the Old Boys' Union continued to maintain a strong financial position despite a reduction in income due to external market conditions. Total income for the year stood at Rs. 880,000/=, down from Rs. 1.27 million in the previous year, primarily due to a decline in interest income following a drop in prevailing interest rates.

On a positive note, total expenses were significantly reduced from Rs. 753,445/= to Rs. 430,823/=, reflecting effective cost control measures and prudent financial management by the Union.

The total assets of the OBU increased from Rs. 20.38 million to Rs. 20.94 million, further strengthening the Union's financial base. This growth demonstrates continued stability and positions the OBU well to support upcoming school development initiatives.

While income was impacted this year, the Union's efficient expense management and steady asset growth reflect its continued commitment to financial stewardship and long-term planning. The OBU remains focused on supporting infrastructure development and other programs by the School. These results reaffirm the Executive Committee's commitment to ensuring that the Union's resources are managed responsibly and strategically, always in service of the enduring progress of S. Thomas' Preparatory School.



### 10. REPORT ON NEW MEMBERS

The following alumni obtained membership of the Old Boys' Union since the last Annual General Meeting. It is the highest enrolment of new members according to the available records.




### 11.2.2 Prep Night Pulse 2024









### 11.2.5 Gandhar IV




### 11.2.11 Sports Meet 2025

### Annexure 1 – Ex-Officio President, Revd. Nihal Fernando's Speech

Good morning to all of you!

Members of the Old Boy's Union of S. Thomas' Preparatory School and distinguished guests, I welcome you all to the Annual General Meeting for 2023. It is my honor and privilege to address you as the headmaster of Prep School and the President of the OBU.
